How Others See Me

Materials: Envelopes, paperclips, small slips of paper-enough for each person in the class to use one for every other person in the class

Directions:

- 1. Paper-clip your name to an envelope.
- 2. Place the envelope in a central location with the envelopes of other class members.
- 3. Without using any names, write one <u>positive characteristic</u> which describes each student in the experience. Write these descriptions on small separate slips of paper, which are anonymously placed in the envelope of the appropriate person.
- 4. The teacher should remove the paper-clipped names from each envelope and thoroughly mix the envelopes. This way an individual's envelope cannot be identified.
- 5. Look for your envelope by reading the descriptions in the envelope and deciding which one fits you.

Debrief:

- Did you find an envelope which you felt described you?
- How did you feel about the description of yourself?
- Did you agree with the descriptions of yourself?
- Did you accept or reject the description of yourself?
- Do others see you the same way you see yourself?
