
STG reserves the right to sell additional slots into each class based on the rate of \$250 per student. Those slots will be for sale up to a point the STG will determine the class is full.

Emergency Response to an Armed Intruder For School Administrators/Staff/Educators/Law Enforcement Train the Trainer Course

Course Description

Overview:

This course incorporates lecture, practical exercises, and scenario based training. Instructors of this course are nationally recognized and bring extensive real-world experience to the program. Our Instructors are current or former police officers and have instructed numerous courses at conferences or symposiums. These instructors have helped design this course to create the most realistic and dynamic advanced tactics program available.

Safariland Training Group (STG) is an industry leader in law enforcement training throughout the United States. STG has provided instruction for every major Agency throughout the US and most Federal Agencies including the Department of Defense, Secret Service, Border Patrol, FBI, and US State Department.

Scope:

This course uses hands-on performance based training designed to increase safety and efficiency in an effort to save lives. The curriculum is designed in modules that are intended to be completed consecutively. They are building blocks of a complete training program that includes planning, communications, rehearsals and mechanics of movement. This course also incorporates new dimensions in training scenarios, environments, and critical thinking/reactionary skills. Prerequisites:

All participants must be in good general health and physical condition and capable of performing minimum physical skills associated with rapid movement, crawling, crouching, and typical movements described in this course.

Required Facility Logistics: (provided by the host Agency)

- Classroom with projectors, screen, and standard instructional equipment
- Training locations that provide typical offices, meeting rooms, hallways, cafeteria, assembly rooms, gymnasium, etc...

Student Equipment Requirements:

- Weather related loose fitting "active wear" clothing

Testing:

Student comprehension of curriculum goals will be evaluated by the instructors through observation of individual participation in classroom and practical exercises, as well as through comments made by participants in debrief sessions concerning the complexity of Active Shooter Incidents. Active participation and expressed understanding of these goals and objectives will determine the level of student achievement. There will be a scenario based exercises that measure the critical thinking skills and physical performance related to each discipline. There will be a certificate issued to all participants that successfully complete the entire 8 hour program.

Evaluation Strategy:

Students are required to complete a course evaluation that focuses on the following issues:

- Value of materials in supporting the course goals and module objectives
- Effectiveness of the instruction (i.e., instructors presented content in an understandable manner, used relevant examples, encouraged participation, and answered questions in a clear and concise manner.)
- Relevance of instruction to each participant's assessment of real-world requirements and concerns.

Terminal Learning Objective:

At the conclusion of this training students will recognize the importance of planning, rehearsals, preparation, and survival techniques associated with an immediate response to an armed Intruder.

Enabling Learning Objectives:

- Layering of security, profiling threats
- Planning, rehearsals, movement, self evacuation
- Ad-hoc barricading, improvised weaponry, angels and distractions
- Rescue carry, Self Aid / Buddy Aid
- Critique, review, and training assessment
