WHAT IS ENDMS?

- eNDMS is JAG's Electronic Data Management System
- A recent update to the system (Fall 2014) created a much easier, user friendly version of the data management system.
- Data entered in eNDMS is pulled by JAG to determine the efficacy of state programs, create annual reports, and determine alignment with national standards.

WHAT IS ENDMS?

- Both program managers and Career Specialists can pull periodic reports to monitor compliance with JAG Model Components implemented through JMG.
- eNDMS houses information such as program rosters, participant profiles, model services, follow-up, job placement, school placement, retention, and graduation data.

WHAT DATA DO WE COLLECT?

- **Model Services:** Lesson plan, delivered on a daily basis to JMG students. Primarily designed to track competencies attained and student contact hours.
- **Follow-up Contacts:** Monthly tracking of seniors (both grads and non-grads) from the previous program year for a ten month period (Sept. – May).

WHAT DATA DO WE COLLECT?

- **Job Placement:** When seniors in follow-up are employed we will record the Job Placement data to include employer, address, position, wage, hours, etc.
- **School Placement:** When seniors in follow-up are attending post-secondary training we will record the School Placement data to include school, address, program of study, school contact, etc.

WHAT DATA DO WE COLLECT?

- **Retention Data:** We collect retention data to track students that do not graduate and ensure they are indeed returning to school.
- **Graduation Dates:** Graduation dates are collected only for seniors in your JMG program. Graduation dates are very important to JAG and are one of the measurements used in “5 of 5” award.

WHY DO WE COLLECT DATA?

- The complete, accurate, and timely entry of data allows schools, states, and JAG the ability to showcase the students served, the services provided, and the outcomes achieved.
- Demonstrates the cost effectiveness of working with students in school, while still achieving the high standards set forth by JAG.

WHY DO WE COLLECT DATA?

- Provides documentation for funders, elected officials, public decision makers, and other stakeholders.
 - Each legislative session we have to answer to the efficiency and efficacy of the program as funding decisions are being made. In order to speak to these measures we have to present concrete data, generated through the eNDMS system.

WHAT MAKES DATA IMPORTANT?

- It allows us to promote the great work you are doing in the classroom through measures others will understand: Graduation Rate, Job Attainment, Transition to High School, Post-Secondary Placement, and so on.

WHAT MAKES DATA IMPORTANT?

- This is how JAG measures our program against all other Charter States.
- This is how JAG determines if our program meets the high standards they place on all charter states.
- “5 of 5”

USING DATA IN THE CLASSROOM

- As a career specialist you are able to access data reports in eNDMS
- So how can you use eNDMS data reports in the classroom?
 - Monitor student barriers to determine areas of primary focus within JMG class.
 - Monitor competency attainment to determine competencies that have been missed (making sure we hit all 37 core competencies)

PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES

- **JAG High School 5 of 5**
- **Criteria JAG uses to measure intervention effectiveness**
 - **Graduation Rate** – JMG students graduating from high school
 - **Job Placement** – Graduates in civilian job placements (PT/FT) or military service
 - **Total Positive Outcomes** – Graduates in part-time or full-time employment, military service, or post-secondary
 - **Full-Time Jobs** – Employed graduates in full-time employment or military service
 - **Full-Time Job Placement** – Employed graduates in full-time employment, military service, or postsecondary education with part time job
